6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Teaching

The college has well qualified and dedicated faculty with many possessing Doctoral degrees who undertake teaching a wide range of UG and PG courses. Their classroom teaching is supplemented by expert lectures given by eminent faculty from Universities and other colleges.

To make teaching more effective and result-oriented innovative pedagogical methodology is also used. Teachers are facilitated in the use of technological audio-visual aids like the OHP through the provision of Smart Classrooms equipped with LCD Projectors, , internet connectivity etc.

Learning

Student-centric participatory methods are encouraged as their enthusiasm and willingness to work helps them to learn. Participative Learning is promoted through assignments, seminars, Project-work, Field study, Self-Learning through Books, Journals, Internet and other sources. Apart from that, Personality Development classes are being held in the campus which also includes training in Communicative English. Free internet access is available. The Library is well-equipped with ICT facilities Latest research journals/articles Experts deliver talks on a specific discipline, and also on inter-disciplinary subjects.

Holistic development of students is ensured through community out-reach initiatives undertaken by various Clubs and Societies with an aim to make them better citizens

Teaching aids are used like , LCD projectors, Models, maps, charts etc. Communication skill, personality development courses are conducted.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination is conducted through continuous Internal Assessment which is based on internals examination like classroom interaction, attendance, presentations etc.

Semester examination is conducted for U.G. classes and semester-wise for P.G. classes. These include theory, practical, viva-voce, and project-work.

The college awards Internal Assessment to the students on the basis of following parameters:

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

For ensuring transparency, the college:

- Shows the answer-sheets to the students, teachers guide about the shortcomings and suggest improvements;
- Internal assessment is displayed on the notice-boards, subject-wise/department-wise;

Students are guided to prepare as per the standards of evaluation. Separate section is formed to conduct tests which consist of a convenor and four members. Regular tests and evaluation is made according to the instruction given by them.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Provision for study-leave and duty-leave is made use of by the faculty optimally to attend national/international seminars/workshops/conferences.

CCTV cameras have been installed in labs and campus to safe-guard costly equipment and to check anti-social elements.

Medicinal Plantation and endangered spices with an area of 2.5 acres is developed in the campus.
