Participative Learning is promoted through assignments, seminars, Project-work, Field study, Self–Learning through Books, Journals, Internet and other sources. Apart from that, Personality Development classes are being held in the campus which also includes training in Communicative English. Free internet access is available. The Library is well-equipped with ICT facilities Latest research journals/articles Experts deliver talks on a specific discipline, and also on inter-disciplinary subjects.

Holistic development of students is ensured through community out-reach initiatives undertaken by various Clubs and Societies with an aim to make them better citizens Teaching aids are used like, LCD projectors, Models, maps, charts etc. Communication skill, personality development courses are conducted.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination is conducted through continuous Internal Assessment which is based on internals examination like classroom interaction, attendance, presentations etc. Semester examination is conducted for U.G. classes and semester-wise for P.G. classes. These include theory, practical, viva-voce, and project-work.


